




## **How do I know if my child has difficulty understanding language (Receptive) or difficulty communicating verbally (Expressive)?**

Below is a list of characteristics associated with a receptive and/ or expressive language delay.

- trouble imitating sounds
- does not produce words or phrases spontaneously
- uses gestures, such as pointing, more than words
- limited vocabulary, compared to other children their age
- difficulty using oral language to communicate immediate wants and needs
- difficulty finding the right words
- struggles to put words together
- trouble following directions
- trouble answering questions
- misunderstanding what others say
- difficulty understanding and learning new vocabulary
